Module 9. Advocacy, Communication, and Social Mobilization (ACSM)

Organizing Principle

The course walks you through the different policies and procedures in NTP implementation following the chapters of the MOP. This chapter is on Advocacy, Communication, and Social Mobilization.

Learning Objectives
